#### **COURSE PREREQUISITES**

This course is designed for learners who have completed Pre-A1 English or equivalent. Students are expected to read and understand very short texts on familiar topics, recognize high-frequency words, and write short, simple phrases and sentences. They should also be able to fill in forms with personal information and write basic guided sentences. The course builds on these foundations to help students achieve A1 proficiency in reading and writing.

### **COURSE GOALS AND CONTENT**

The primary goal of the course is to develop students' ability to read short texts with understanding and to produce connected writing at the paragraph level. Each unit combines reading and writing skills around relevant themes. In reading, students practice skimming and scanning, identifying main ideas and details, recognizing chronological order, using context to understand meaning, and note-taking from short informative or narrative texts. In writing, students learn to produce sentences and short paragraphs, write about routines, express opinions and preferences, summarize short texts, describe people and places, write guided narratives, compare items, and organize ideas using basic connectors.



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#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

Upon the completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Read and understand short, simple texts about familiar topics.
- 2. Identify main ideas, supporting details, and specific information in short texts.
- 3. Write connected sentences and short paragraphs with basic organization.
- 4. Express opinions, likes/dislikes, and daily activities in writing.
- 5. Use simple connectors (and, but, because, so) to join sentences.
- 6. Summarize short texts and organize ideas using simple notes or charts.
- 7. Revise and edit writing for spelling, punctuation, and clarity.

## **SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES**

By the end of each unit, students will be able to:

- Read fact files and short descriptive texts about places, identify and name facilities, and write simple sentences and short paragraphs about campus life using basic structures.
- 2. Read informative texts about daily routines and jobs, take notes, and write short paragraphs describing a typical day.
- 3. Skim and scan short texts and recipes, understand examples, and write opinion texts comparing food preferences.
- 4. Read short texts for meaning and attitude, identify explanations and glossary items, and write short weather forecasts or seasonal descriptions.
- 5. Read short stories and diagrams, identify main plot elements, and write guided narratives or summaries of events.
- 6. Read short texts about shopping and advertising, understand topic-related vocabulary, and write short blog entries or notes expressing opinions.
- 7. Use context and headings to predict meaning, read short problem/solution texts, and write short descriptions or reports about situations.
- 8. Read short texts about rivers, lakes, and cities, identify specific details, and write short descriptive texts about places.
- 9. Read short texts about friendship and trends, understand specialized vocabulary, and write short paragraphs expressing opinions on social activities.
- 10. Read short process texts with headings, identify steps in order, and write short descriptive paragraphs about simple processes.
