COURSE PREREQUISITES

Students enrolled in the B2 Writing course are expected to have successfully completed a B1-level writing program. Learners should be able to write coherent paragraphs and short essays on familiar topics, express opinions with basic support, summarize texts, use common linking devices, and demonstrate control of core grammatical structures such as basic tenses, passives, and conditionals. They are also expected to revise and edit their writing for clarity, organization, and basic accuracy. The course builds on these skills to move toward more independent, structured B2 writing.

COURSE GOALS AND CONTENT

This course aims to develop learners' ability to produce clear, well-organized, and linguistically accurate written texts appropriate for academic contexts. Through an integrated skills approach, students engage with a range of thematic texts and tasks that support the inductive and communicative learning of advanced grammatical structures. Writing instruction focuses on essay development, including opinion, compare-and-contrast, and cause-effect texts, while emphasizing coherence, argumentation, and grammatical accuracy. Grammar is

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systematically embedded within reading, listening, and writing activities to support meaningful language use and to enhance learners' overall written proficiency at the B2 level.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the course, students will be able to:

1. Produce clear, detailed, and well-structured written texts on a wide range of topics related to academic and social contexts.
2. Develop and support arguments in writing using appropriate examples, explanations, and logical reasoning.
3. Organize written discourse coherently by using a variety of linking devices and discourse markers effectively.
4. Demonstrate control of advanced grammatical structures and a broad range of vocabulary in written production.
5. Adapt tone and style appropriately for different writing purposes.
6. Revise and edit written work independently to improve clarity, cohesion, and linguistic accuracy.

SPECIFIC COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of each unit, students will be able to:

1. Plan and write coherent academic texts by producing clear thesis statements, organizing ideas into well-developed paragraphs, and writing effective introductions and conclusions using appropriate academic registers.
2. Plan and produce well-organized academic essays on future-oriented topics by developing clear thesis statements, constructing coherent outlines, and writing logically connected body paragraphs revising their written work for coherence, cohesion, and grammatical accuracy.
3. Write a well-structured opinion essay by clearly stating a position in a thesis statement, developing arguments with relevant reasons and examples, and organizing ideas into coherent paragraphs with effective topic sentences, while using appropriate linking devices, maintaining an academic tone.
4. Write a coherent and persuasive opinion essay on complex issues by developing a clear thesis, supporting viewpoints with well-chosen reasons and examples, and addressing alternative perspectives, while using a range of discourse markers, conditionals, and evaluative language to strengthen argumentation.
5. Write well-organized compare & contrast essays on abstract and real-world topics by selecting clear criteria for comparison, organizing ideas using block or point-by-point structures, and developing balanced paragraphs that highlight similarities and differences, while using a wide range of cohesive devices and comparative structures.
6. Revise and refine compare & contrast and opinion essays by strengthening thesis statements, clarifying comparison criteria and viewpoints, and improving paragraph

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balance and coherence, while using a wider range of comparative structures, evaluative language, and discourse markers to enhance argumentation.

7. Write well-structured cause & effect essays on complex social, academic, or real-world issues by clearly identifying causes and consequences, organizing ideas logically across paragraphs, and supporting relationships with relevant examples and explanations using a range of cause & effect connectors and complex sentence structures.
8. Revise, edit, and improve opinion, compare & contrast, and cause & effect essays by refining thesis statements, strengthening argumentation and logical relationships, and improving paragraph unity and coherence, while applying a wide range of discourse markers, complex sentence structures, and academic vocabulary, and using feedback to enhance accuracy, clarity, and overall effectiveness of written texts.
